Admission Requirements

Applicants must meet the following conditions to be eligible for admission:

- Completion of at least a bachelor's degree.
- Successful completion of the admission examination.
- Proof of English language proficiency.

Proof of English proficiency at B2 level or higher has to be submitted, i.e. IELTS 6 or higher, TOEFL iBT 78 or higher, FCE, CAE, CPE, Duolingo 110 or higher or another internationally accepted English certificate equivalent to B2 level of the CEFR. The submission of the proof of English is not required from native speakers or students who have completed the bachelor's degree taught in English. The faculty reserves the right to test students who provide a Duolingo certificate as proof of English proficiency with an additional oral examination (online interview). This may be particularly required if the student is likely to be nominated for the student visa mode (režim student).

- Applicants have to submit a scan of their international passport (or national ID for EU citizens).
- Applicants can take the admission exam for the academic year 2026/2027 only once, either within the application round I or II.

Admission Examination Form

1. Essay / Case study

EDA: Submission of an essay in English (approx. 2,000 words) on a given topic related to the programme.

ISM: Submission of a case study in English (approx. 2,000 words) on a given topic related to the programme. Both are conducted remotely and submitted electronically.

2. Aptitude for study

Aptitude for study in both study programmes is assessed from a **structured curriculum vitae** (a given template, which includes information on previous studies, grades, passed courses and certificates, work experience) and a **motivational video**.

Verification method of the condition of acceptance

A completion of at least the bachelor's degree programme must be verified before the enrolment in the studies by submission of officially notarized copy of the university diploma, a notarised copy of a diploma supplement or a transcript of records. Furthermore, applicants who gained the bachelor's degree programme at a foreign university, must submit its officially certified translation into Czech or English, if applicable.

Decision on admission

Admission will be determined by the order of the applicants who have met the admission conditions declared by the Dean for the total point count.

In the event that the applicants who have been admitted do not use their right to enrol into studies (Section 51 of Act No. 111/1998 Coll.), applicants who file an appeal against the non-acceptance decision can be admitted to these vacancies. In this case, the criteria will be the order of total points earned, fulfilment of the conditions of admission and the appeal against the non-acceptance decision.

The holders of the government scholarship programmes of the Czech Republic for developing countries¹ will undergo a different admission procedure corresponding to the requirements and conditions of the Government Scholarship program. The Dean of the Faculty of Informatics and Statistics may accept them according to those requirements.

Application for study

The application for study is submitted electronically. The assigned username and password must be carefully stored for further communication with the Faculty of Informatics and Statistics.

Once the application has been filled in, the applicant will receive (to the provided e-mail address) instructions about the account number and variable symbol needed for the payment of the fee (50 EUR) for the admission procedure. The fee can be paid directly in the e-application system via credit card as well.

An application is considered as filed when it is filled in correctly, and the application fee in the required amount is paid and received at the university's respective account.

The fee is non-refundable. Only applicants who paid the application fee and filled out the whole application form will be allowed to take the admission exam.

Applicants to the Information Systems Management programme fill in one application form, where they have to choose one or both specializations (Management of Business Informatics, Data & Business) and a priority of the specialization has to be stated.

All documents (except for the essay / case study assignment) in the admission procedure are delivered by VŠE via its electronic information system InSIS.

Applicants make all submissions to the VŠE electronically via its electronic information system InSIS.
